The first webcast titled "Driver Recruiting in an Era of Driver Shortages: How to Effectively Qualify and Screen Drivers" featured Doug Simpson, CTP, driver recruiting manager for the Castellini Group of Companies. #### NPTC LOOKS TO ENHANCE TRUCK SIZE AND WEIGHT IN NEW CONGRESS

As the economy recovers, demand for truck shipments will increase dramatically. The amount of freight hauled by trucks in the U.S. is expected to double by 2035. As a result, NPTC is focusing on increased productivity as one of its primary legislative objectives in the new Congress.

We have joined the Steering Committee of the Coalition for Transportation Productivity, a group of shippers, motor carriers and their associations seeking to increase truck weight limits. The Coalition is asking Congress to allow states to increase the federal vehicle weight limit to 97,000 lbs. for vehicles equipped with an additional (sixth) axle for travel on Interstate highways. These vehicles would have to meet the same safety standards as trucks currently allowed on Interstates.

Six-axle trucks carrying 97,000 lbs. get 17% more ton-miles per gallon of fuel than five-axle trucks carrying 80,000 lbs. The U.S. Dept. of Transportation estimates that use of six-axle trucks would save 2 billion gal. of diesel fuel annually and reduce engine emissions by 19% per ton-mile.

This issue affects our international competitiveness as well. Europe, the United Kingdom, Canada and Mexico all have maximum truck weights well in excess of the 80,000 lbs. allowed on U.S. Interstate highways.

#### **2015 BENCHMARKING SURVEY**

The benchmarking survey has been sent out to the NPTC fleet members. NPTC conducts an annual Private Fleet Benchmarking Survey, sponsored by PeopleNet, designed to (1) validate private fleet performance based on comparative peer data, (2) identify areas of improvement and opportunity, and (3) identify the significant trends affecting private fleet practitioners. This survey is designed for the benefit of our members and the private fleet community. The purpose is to help members benchmark their operation to other best-in-class performers, thereby validating performance and identifying areas of opportunity. A preliminary report will be presented at the Benchmarking Summit at the Annual Conference and the final report will be released August 1 of this year.

A preliminary report of the survey results, which will be free to all registrants of the annual conference, will be released once again this year.
