Q&A

Q Do you know of companies that allow riders? I'm looking to find out if our rider policy should be updated. Currently, we allow drivers to have an approved rider who is at least 16 years old. I'm considering reducing that age based on requests that I'm getting from my drivers.

A From one of our supplier members: "I had the same question come up from a few of our OTR clients. The consensus from that group was no one under 12 permitted to ride along."

"We only have the unofficial policy of allowing riders permitting they can 'be comfortable and not distracting', It's all subjective and as I stated, unofficial."

"Our policy is 18. Our lawyers set it there because 'being of legal age'."

"From another member: In regards to the rider policy that I used to have at two previous companies, we did not allow any riders unless they were authorized company representatives riding along for company business. There were no exceptions to our policy. We had them carry our company rider authorization form with them as well that I had signed as the authorizer."

"We, currently, don't allow any driver to ride unless approved by management. Our insurance company said that we would have to add a riding to our policy if we started allowing families to ride." "Our company has a policy which prohibits any riders who are not employees. We do have safety days or roadeos with families attending and we do rides but we stay within company property."

"Below is our policy. The reason we authorize some is for training or to assist driver to unload. Sometimes a management employee may ride along and we give this person a permit to ride. This was recommended by our insurance company to prevent any liability issues.

Unless specifically authorized in writing by the Transportation Manager, Transportation Supervisor or the Distribution Center Manager, no driver shall transport any person or permit any person to be transported in his/her vehicle. No pets are allowed to be transported in XXX equipment.

Any driver carrying unauthorized riders will be terminated immediately."

"We follow the same guidelines, minimum age 16."

"No passengers are allowed within the first six months of the driver's start date with DTI. Also, no passengers are allowed without a release from DTI. This form must be signed by the passenger with the original remaining at the office. These forms can be obtained by contacting Dispatch. You may obtain a release form for a member of your immediate family, which includes only: Father, Mother, Spouse, Brother, Sister, Children and Grandchildren the age of 12 or older. Immediate family members between the ages of 8 - 11 may "ride along" on the transfer turn around loads only. In addition a fiancée or significant other is allowed with manager approval. Only one passenger is permitted to ride along at a time."

"Our company used to allow riders years ago (any age), with a signed liability release. However our Risk Management department/insurance carrier later changed that policy. For the last 10+ years, no riders are allowed. I would definitely check with the insurance company on whether it is allowed or not."

"At our company, the age is 10 for a child or grandchild. The drivers must also be employed for a minimum of three years, in good standing and no on-road accidents."

The Second Time's the Charm!

orn and raised in the Allentown, Pennsylvania, with deep roots in the community (his grandfather spent his career as an engineer for Mack Trucks, Inc.), Ed Schultes, CTP, and his wife of nearly 30 years still reside in the area and are

parents of five children (three boys and two girls). The oldest son is 24 years old and is somewhat following his father in the transportation industry as a trained professional diesel mechanic. Their youngest child is 15.

Ed says, "My wife and I feel that being proud parents of five wonderful young people is the highlight of our lives—and a terrific honor and a great partnership. My wife has been the full time stay-home mom and I've been the single-income provider for twentynine years. Fortunately, many of those years have been with the best employer possible in Walgreens."

When Ed finished his formal schooling, he didn't imagine at the time a career in supply chain/logistics. By happenstance, however,

he was hired by a local business franchise for home windows and doors which gave him his initial work experience and training in management, dispatch, DOT regulations, safety and driver training, and risk management. This broad range of work experience served him well in landing his first job with Walgreens and his first exposure to the NPTC.

Over a two year period, Walgreens encouraged Ed to enroll in and complete all of the home study courses offered through NPTC on the five core disciplines still featured in the CTP program. He subsequently relocated to Maryland to work for a major manufacturer under the supervision of George Hunter (former NPTC Board member and Private Fleet Executive of the Year winner in 2011) who encouraged him to complete the CTP program based on the study he had completed while at Walgreens through home study.

Ed found himself too busy and decided to take a pass. After several more years working for other transportation and logistics companies, he and his family returned to the Allentown area and he rejoined Walgreens as a member of the private fleet management team back at the same location where he worked before.

"Looking back, I know I missed an opportunity to get certified, but several years after returning to Walgreens the company offered me the CTP opportunity—and I jumped at the

chance!," says Schultes. Ed went through the five-day Private Fleet Management Institute and graduated with the CTP Class of 2009. "It was an incredible experience. Although by then I had several years of successful experience in supply chain man-

> agement, I learned a great deal by going through the program and meeting dozens of professionals in the field-many of whom I stay in contact with even today."

Ed's story would not be complete without mentioning the fact that he is the only person in the 22-year history of the CTP program who became a CTP not once-but twice.

After three years as a CTP, Ed had not completed enough of the required recertification points to have his CTP status remain active. When Jacob Klingbeil, CTP, became Director of Fleet Operations at Walgreens, and went through the CTP program himself, interest in the CTP program was resurrected and other candidates from Walgreens followed.

Inspired by Jacob's leadership example and support, Ed decided to take the CTP Examination again and regain his credential. He participated in the 2014 Private Fleet Management Institute as a faculty member/facilitator on customer service and also participated in several of the group break-out sessions. He passed the exam and joined the CTP Class of 2014.

"Walgreens uses the NPTC as a valuable resource in helping scorecard best practices and justify the private fleet to upper management," says Ed. "Each time we return from NPTC's Annual conference, we prepare an ROI report for upper management which shows what new ideas we are bringing to the private fleet to optimize resources, containing costs and Improving service capacity."

Ed says the first time he went through the CTP program it was for self-accomplishment; the second time it was more for team recognition and affirmation. "Walgreens plans to send two additional candidates through the PFMI and CTP program in 2016. We now have a culture and tradition in place at Walgreens which makes earning the CTP something special and appreciated within the company."

"I could not be more proud of my company's affiliation with NPTC, our leadership support, and with the letters "CTP" after my name."

NPTC/J. J. KELLER SET TWO WEBCASTS FOR OCTOBER: "CSA UPDATE" AND "SUCCESSFUL DATAQ'S STRATEGIES"

n October, NPTC and J.J. Keller & Associates conclude their 2015 webcast series with two webcasts, free to NPTC members. The first, on **Wednesday, October 14**, will be, **"CSA Update."** While it has been around for a while now, CSA is still an important issue to carriers. Its primary purpose is to locate under-performing carriers for "intervention" (a warning or an investigation). The vast majority of carriers investigated each year are selected based on their CSA scores alone. In this webcast we will be highlighting the past, recent, and upcoming changes to the CSA program, as well as the increased use of the focused off-site investigations and the cooperative safety plan intervention options, the status of the crash preventability study, and the Safety Fitness Determination proposal. We will also look at strategies carriers can use to hopefully prevent being selected for an intervention. **Joseph M. Dilley, Sr., CDS**, Director of Transportation & Fleet Safety, Oldcastle Precast Inc., will be the featured fleet presenter.

The following day, **Thursday**, **October 15**, the webcast will focus on **"Successful DataQs Strategies."** DataQs is the system the FMCSA provides to carriers and drivers to challenge data that is in the FMCSA's data systems that is incorrect. Failing to use the system can be impacting your scores in CSA, as well as giving officers on the road and investigators at the FMCSA the wrong impression of your company. In this webcast we will discuss how to spot something that should be in your data or that is incorrect, how the DataQs process works, the tactics that should be used to be successful when filing a DataQs challenge, and provide a detailed explanation of the "adjudicated citation policy." **Mike Little, CTP**, Director, Service First Distribution/Mid-South Baking, will be the featured fleet speaker.
