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NPTC/INTERNATIONAL TRUCKS RECOGNIZE 27 NATIONAL DRIVER ALL-STARS

WENTY-SEVEN PRIVATE FLEET TRUCK DRIVERS WHO HAVE DEMONSTRATED HIGH PERFORM-ANCE STANDARDS against their peer drivers through-

out the country based on customer service, safety, adherence to company standards, regulatory compliance, and community service have been honored by the National Private Truck Council (NPTC) as National Driver All-Stars. The award is co-sponsored by International Trucks.

"These drivers embody all the characteristics, skills and attitudes that are the heart of what enables the private fleet to continue to deliver exceptional levels of customer service," according to NPTC President and CEO Gary Petty. "They are ambassadors, not only for their company, but for the entire private fleet community. We are honored to recognize these private fleet drivers for meeting high performance standards in the fields of customer service, safety and compliance."

NPTC initiated the National Driver All-Stars program in 2009 to recognize those drivers of NPTC fleet member companies based on how they perform against their own internal customer service metrics. Specific measures of the recognition include:

- Customer service (uniform/appearance; on-time deliveries; attitude/conduct; customer feedback; loading/unloading; cooperation)
- Safety (number of DOT reportable accidents; number of OSHA reportable injuries; number of traffic violations verified by current MVR)
- Compliance with company standards (attendance, attendance at safety meetings, training, paperwork, etc.)
- Regulatory compliance (hours of service, DVIR, MVR, etc.)
- Community service

OHN ROBBINS, CTP, IS SENIOR DIRECTOR, OPER-ATIONS, STANDARD LOGISTICS TRANSPORTATION, and a member of the NPTC Board of Directors. Trained as an 82nd Airborne paratrooper and combat infantryman, he served his country honorably for twenty years in the U.S. Army with multiple deployments from Ft. Benning, Georgia, to the country of Panama.

In high school, John wrestled, joined ROTC, and graduated from Plano High School with 1375 students, the largest graduating high school class in Texas. John enlisted for military service shortly thereafter.

"I always wanted to be a Marine growing up," says John. "My grandfather was in the Marine Corps and I expected to follow the family legacy. When I went to the Marine Recruiting Office to sign up, however, the recruiter came off as a complete jerk. I walked to the nearby U.S. Army Recruiter and never looked back."

After ten years of active military duty, John joined the Army Reserve and spent the second half of his Army career in transportation. He started out in a civilian job for Safety Kleen (now Clean Harbors) as a transportation manager focused on third-party carrier relationships, and eventually moved up to Director of Logistics and later Vice President of Logistics and Transportation.

In 2021, John joined Standard Logistics in a fleet management role. The company, owned

by Standard Industries, is the private fleet and logistics transportation services partner for GAF, North America's largest roofing and waterproofing company. The fleet's primary business is moving raw materials and finished products mostly for roofing replacement of commercial and residential projects.

"When I started, we had 140 drivers—all leased—and 15 support staff," says Robbins. "Today, our ratio is 60% employee drivers and 40% leased drivers which gives us better control and flexibility. Now we have 380 drivers operating out of 18 locations, 75 support staff, 375 tractors and 675 trailers. We are growing deliberately in areas where we can add value and reduce risk within the supply chain.

"The best part of my job is talking to drivers, being their advocate, helping them anyway I can. The care and respect we show our drivers is a differentiating selling point in recruiting and retention. We provide excellent pay and benefits, a high-quality work environment, and company-paid in-service training.

> "A mentor is assigned to help each new driver get off on the right foot. Our driver culture is a competitive advantage. Creativity and transparency have been key to attracting new drivers and building our fleet out. As a result, we are attracting a top-quality class of seasoned and younger drivers."

> John says the key to their success is an amazing team which works miracles. "The way our people come together to help or boost one another is just incredible. We have doubled our business in the past year, and we've only gotten closer as colleagues as the work volume grows."

> Engagement with NPTC also contributes to the team's success. "We have sent several people through the Private Fleet Management Institute and Certified Transportation Professional® programs. The Institute is probably the best consolidated educational program in transportation I've ever seen. NPTC's annual conference is a great event because everyone is open, willing to share, and learn

from one another. The one-on-one networking conversations are incredibly valuable."

2023 was a banner year for the company. Standard Logistics was one of three companies awarded *Fleet Owner 500 Private Fleet of the Year* honors in a special ceremony at the NPTC annual conference in Orlando. Standard Logistics also became a Five-Star Member of the NPTC and John was elected to the NPTC Institute Board of Governors. Recently, he was also elected to the NPTC Board of Directors.

To become and remain qualified to drive, a driver must pass a DOT physical. The process involves a driver being examined by a medical professional that is on the National Registry of Certified Medical Examiners (NRCME). The examiner will use various sources, such as the Medical Examiner's Handbook, the Medical Advisory Criteria, the Medical Review Board recommendations, and his or her judgement to determine if the driver is qualified based on the requirements in §391.41.

In an era of growing driver shortages, fleet managers have a direct role in ensuring the driver passes the exam. Learn some of the best practices that fleets are using to enhance driver health and

Benchmarking Report a Deep Dive into Fleet Operations

HE NPTC 2024 BENCHMARKING SURVEY REPORT, an exclusive members-only benefit sponsored by NPTC Five-Star member company, Penske Truck Leasing Company, was published on August 1, 2024.

The Report is widely regarded as the foremost authoritative resource of private fleet practices in the United States and one of the most valuable benefits of Council membership. This publication has become the "gold standard" by which private fleets assess, justify, and scorecard their performance and continuously improve their operations.

"This Report is an especially valuable part of NPTC services," says **Steven Roberts, CTP**, member of the NPTC Board of Directors and Fleet Manager of Deseret Transportation, the private fleet of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints. "It gives us a deep dive into our own operations as compared to other fleets."

Confidentiality and trust are hallmarks of the Report. Information collected from participating fleet companies is treated as privileged and proprietary and never discussed or shared within or outside NPTC. Aggregate data shown in the report itself is anonymous and made without attribution as to individuals and their corporate affiliations.

NPTC retains sole and exclusive management control of the report including the survey questionnaire, data collection, analysis, production, and distribution to participating fleet companies. For the first time, the survey questionnaire was offered this year in an electronic format designed exclusively for the Council to ease the process of data submission and further enhance security.

Produced under the leadership direction of author and general editor, **Tom Moore, CTP**, NPTC Executive Vice President, the report has evolved over the years into the largest and most comprehensive research project ever conducted on private fleet best practices and operational protocols.

To augment the value of the report, Mr. Moore will, upon request, provide participating individual fleets with customized "data pulls" which show how their fleet compares with other peer fleets operating in the same business sector, as well as to show how their fleet's data stacks up against national trends and norms.

The Council wishes to recognize and thank members of the **Benchmarking Steering Committee** who helped "test-drive" the new survey platform and assist in making other improvements

in the Report this year. Consistent with participation in past years, more than 122 fleet member companies participated in the 2024 report. Surveyed companies are a representative mix of diverse business markets throughout the U.S. economy. Participating companies have, on average, 44 terminals; 512 drivers, and 879 or more trailers. Driver turnover came in at 20.2%, down from 22% two years ago but above the previously reported 14.5% running turnover average for more than a dozen years.

"Safety continues to be a major focus," says Moore, "DOT Recordable is 0.61—the highest since 2017 which was also 0.61."

David Fontana, CTP, National Fleet Manager, AutoZone, says "The benchmarking report is a great tool for fleet justification. We're big believers and have participated for s everal y ears. Learning about leading operating trends of other fleets has helped us meet the challenges of double-digit growth in the past three years."

The National Private Truck Council's Certified Transportation Professional® Class of 2025 is now forming. Eligibility applications are due December 1, 2024. CTP candidates are encouraged to attend the CTP Exam Preparation workshop. The workshop is a full-day, specialized study group led by NPTC Executive Vice President, Tom Moore, CTP. Polish your writing skills, prepare for the case study analysis, network with candidates, and complete a sample multiple choice examination.



To become a CTP, you must pass a two-part examination offered virtually on Saturday, February 8, 2025 (no exceptions)

Part One consists of shortanswer essay questions focusing on the core areas of fleet/transportation management. You will have two hours to complete this part of the examination.

(One hour break)

For Part Two, you will be given a case study and asked to submit a written analysis of the problem and your recommendations for solving the problem. You will be given two hours to complete this portion of the examination.



Once you earn your CTP designation, we encourage you to attend the NPTC Annual Education Management Conference and Exhibition, which will be held May 11-13, 2025. The Graduation Ceremony takes place during the opening General Session on Sunday, May 11. Plus, you will be able to connect and reconnect with other CTPs in educational workshops, on the exhibit hall floor, and during informal networking sessions.

Recertification is a mandatory element of all job-based certification programs - the CTP program is no different. The Recertification guidelines are designed to ensure the continued transportation-related education of the individuals who earn the CTP designation. On an annual basis, CTPs will be invoiced \$100 to maintain active and participatory status. CTPs must earn and submit 50 recertification points every three vears.
