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Largest Class of CTPs Earns Designation



Sixty-nine transportation professionals achieved the prestigious designation of Certified Transportation Professional[®] (CTP) by the NPTC Institute, the educational and professional certification arm of the National Private Truck Council. The graduates were honored during a ceremony at the Annual Education Management Conference and Exhibition held April 29, 2012 in Cincinnati.

Since the CTP designation was first introduced in 1993, nearly 900 fleet and transportation

professionals have earned the right to add CTP after their name. CTPs are raising industry standards, and in turn, increasing the respect and prestige of the fleet and transportation profession.

Please submit questions and/or comments to Tom Moore, CTP, tmoore@nptc.org. **Q.** "With the spate of tornados and other severe weather that occurred earlier this year, what best practices are fleets using to alert and/or re-route drivers while on the road?"

A. Here are some replies from the NPTC Safety Committee:

"We use our onboard computer's email system to alert our drivers of changes to the original plan whether operational, customer, or weather related."

"We alert the drivers to the bad

weather and allow them to make the best decisions in interest of their safety and wellbeing.

"Our drivers are told in the case of emergency, if possible head to the closest one of our stores where they can get help and be safe. IF none is available they are told to trust their instincts and get to the safest location."

"We have in cab GPS communication. Weather is monitored by both dispatch and our Loss Prevention/Security department, and alerts are sent to the drivers to take cover if necessary."

One company provided a checklist that addresses the following areas: Communications, Driver Preparation and Sustainment, Equipment Preparation and Sustainment, Customer Management, Transportation Support, and Delivery Concerns.

CTP Profile: Joey Wood, CTP – 2012 Top Graduate

"Those CTP initials really mean something. They give you more credibility." One of the highlights of the National Private Truck Council Annual Education Management Conference and Exhibition is always the recognition of those who have successfully completed the rigorous Certified Transportation Professional (CTP) training and certification program. This year's conference in Cincinnati, OH, was no exception.

Fleet Owner, which sponsors the Top CTP Graduate Award, was also on hand to help honor Joey Wood, platinum customer manager for PeopleNet and the CTP top Graduate for 2012. He received a crystal eagle as a symbol of his achievement. Wood, who joined PeopleNet in 2009, says that he did not expect to graduate at the top of his class, but that he is proud of the CTP certification. "Training is valued pretty highly at this organization," he said. "When they asked me if I wanted to participate in the CTP program, I said 'yes;' [it was a great opportunity]."

Back in January, Wood began working toward his certification by attending the annual CTP training program offered by the NPTC Institute. After that, he settled down to a month of studying and practicing especially for the case study portion of the certification test. Fellow PeopleNet employees who had already earned the certification were also a huge help, he notes. "We had people right here at the company that I could talk with about the test," Wood says. "That made a big difference."

"I am not an advertiser when it comes to this stuff; I don't like to be boastful," he adds." In fact, when they emailed me to say I was the top graduate, I wrote back asking 'Are you sure you got the right person?' I was just hoping to pass the test the first time so that I did not have to retake it again in March."

2012 National Safety Conference – Register Now!
