STANDARDS IN PRIVATE FLEET EXCELLENCE TASK FORCE

More than two dozen companies have joined the Task Force to develop industry "Standards and Templates in Private Fleet Excellence." These standards will help private fleet managers conduct an executive review for private fleet evaluation based on identified best practices, benchmarking metrics, and normative policies and practices typical of leading private fleet operations. Members of the Task Force have been individually interviewed to get their assessments on the nearly two-dozen commonly-used standards identified in most evaluations. A preliminary report of recommendations from the Task Force will be presented to the NPTC National Advisory Board and NPTC Board of Directors on September 14, 2005. A start date for implementation will be set in late fall.

FLEET MANAGEMENT INSTITUTE

The Planning Committee for the 2006 NPTC Fleet Management Institute has completed its preliminary recommendations for subjects, speakers and panels for next year's Institute scheduled for January 14-18, 2006, at the Jacksonville Hilton Hotel located in Jacksonville, Florida. The Institute is an intense, five-day, 40-hour educational immersion experience of unsurpassed value for fleet managers. Tuition for Early Bird registrations on or before December 3, 2005, can be as low as \$1,800 for NPTC Members. Although the Institute's curriculum has historically focused on the five core disciplines, the emphasis in 2006 will be on financial management, corporate communication, and human resources, with particular emphasis on Standards and Templates in Private Fleet Management. Some 55 individuals participated in the 2005 program.
