NPTC NATIONAL SAFETY CONFERENCE

BENCHMARKING SURVEY UPDATE

Earlier this month, NPTC released its 2016 Benchmarking Survey Report, which examines a number of key operational, performance issues and is designed to validate private fleet performance based on comparative peer data; to identify areas of improvement and opportunity; and to highlight significant trends affecting private fleet practitioners.

The benchmarking survey delves into key operational areas such as safety, technology, driver turnover, compensation, operational costs, equipment and maintenance to identify key trends and best practices. As in previous surveys, the most common reasons for operating a private fleet are (1) to gain direct control of transportation capacity on demand. (2) to control costs, and (3) to provide consistent and high-quality customer service.

Private fleets stand out as a dynamically growing transportation market. The largest sector of the trucking industry, they account for about 50% of all Class 8 truck sales, and own or lease some three out of four Class 4 through Class 8 trucks on the road. About 40% of all leased trucks are to private fleet companies. In 10 years, the private fleet vehicle count has risen by 50% among the top several hundred companies, even as the existing populations has become more efficient. And a majority of private fleet managers (more than two-thirds) plan to add trucks to their fleet capacity in the years ahead.

NPTC/J.J. KELLER WEBCAST UPDATE

Last month, more than 700 people tuned in to participate in one of two webcasts co-sponsored by NPTC and J.J. Keller & Associates.

Drug & Alcohol Testing focused on one of the most frequently cited violations found during DOT compliance reviews are violations. Pre-employment, random, and post-accident testing are always near the top of the list. With thousands of dollars in fines, public safety, and CSA scores at risk, motor carriers were told that they need to understand their role in preventing the use of drugs and abuse of alcohol by commercial drivers.

In this webcast, we examined what the regulations require and how fleets are coping with the rules and even going the extra mile—by incorporating hair follicle testing into their compliance protocols. Our special fleet speaker was Kris Kolbe, CTP, manager, transportation compliance, Bridgestone Americas KrisKolbe Tire Operations.



The second webcast focused on the Aging Driver Workforce, Driver Wellness and Worker's Compensation. With an the average age of the driver population now exceeding 50 in many fleets, safety officials are witnessing an ac-

celeration of healthcare and worker's compensation costs. How do leading fleets protect their investment in the driver?

This webcast looked into the effectiveness of driver training, education and the incorporation of effective health and wellness programs. Ruffin Price, transportation safety and training lead, Harris Teeter Inc., was the featured fleet speaker.
