2018 SAFETY AWARD APPLICATIONS

NPTC and Lytx Inc. offer two different ways in which your fleet and your drivers can be recognized for their commitment to improving highway safety:

• Fleet Safety Awards recognize fleets for outstanding and/or improved safety records based on their crash rates. First, second and third place awards are given for large and small fleets in each of the three operational categories (local, regional, mixed). Gold, silver and bronze seal certificates are also presented to private fleets that have reduced their vehicle accident frequency rates.

• Driver Hall of Fame Awards honor four exceptional drivers each year. A driver must have driven 3 million miles, 20 years, or 50,000 hours with no preventable accidents. Drivers must be a regularly employed full-time, leased, or dedicated driver of an NPTC member company who is actively driving until time of induction.

Applications for both awards must be received by February 2, 2018.
