# COURT UPHOLDS PRIVATE FLEET DISTINCTION

A California court has reaffirmed long-standing positions of the US. Congress, state legislatures and courts that private fleets are separate and distinct entities from for-hire motor carriers, and that a private fleet is not vicariously liable for the negligent acts of its independent contractor. The unanimous opinion of the Court said that to hold a private fleet liable for the negligence of its independent contractors would open the floodgates of litigation and would "certainly increase the cost of doing business...particularly the cost of insurance, and would effectively spread risk to parties without consideration of fault and without sound policy basis."

## DIRECT-STORE DELIVERY COMMITTEE FORMED

The Council organized its first meeting of the newly-created Direct Store Delivery Conmittee, a special group of members interested in addressing a variety of challenges and issues unique to direct store delivery, as well as sharing of "benchmarking" and "best practices." Chair of the DSD Committee is Lee Falk, Director of Logistics, Midwest Region, Dean Foods Company, which makes approximately 6500 DSD deliveries per day during a typical week.

# PRIVATE FLEET BENCHMARK STUDY 2005

**NPTC** has retained the services of McFain & Associates Research, Inc., of Boise, Idaho, to conduct a descriptive overview survey of private fleet practices and performance standards which would aid private fleet professionals in assessing how their fleets compare with normative practices of similar private fleets across the country and across several industry sectors. A comparable study was conducted by the Council in 2001.

Information analyzed in the survey will include: profit center versus cost center; growth or reduction in fleet size; purpose and uses of private fleet; inbound/outbound freight comparisons; size and types of vehicles; with or without separate for-hire authority; average length of trips; employee versus leased drivers; how maintenance is provided; leasing versus buying of equipment; replacement schedules for equipment; operating costs per mile, and other critical standards of measurement. The Private Fleet Benchmark Study 2005, which will be conducted entirely online, will be published in March and available for sale to the industry or free to private fleet companies that participate in the study.

## NPTC & J.J. KELLER WEBINAR DRAWS HUGE TURNOUT

**The Council and J.J. Keller & Associates, Inc.** recently presented their first joint venture webinar which drew a record 367 registrants, making it one of the most successful training events ever conducted by either organization. One planned session grew to three separate sessions in order to accommodate the virtual "overflow crowds". The subject, "Mitigating Fleet Driver Risk", was itself a reason for the high turnout of participants. Kevin Connors, CTP, Sr. Director, Safety, ConAgra Foods and Ed Emerick, Transportation Consultant with Keller, were the prime presenters along with Keller driver manager specialist, Kevin Goen. The moderator was Gary Petty of NTPC.

During the free, one-hour sessions, presenters provided critical fleet management information to help professionals gain an understanding of how technology and changing regulations can impact their driver management responsibilities. The presentation incorporated an overview of the new Safety Performance History of New Drivers Regulation, in addition to including a discussion of the importance of a standardized process for hiring drivers and managing driver requirements, ways to limit exposure to risk and liability, and how to avoid the most common mistakes related to hiring and managing drivers.

Participants in the webinar gave "rave reviews" to the program. One private fleet manager called it a "terrific program" and a venue NPTC needs to pursue on a consistent basis. Another webinar participant said, "I was very pleased with the information...we are hiring new drivers and are not familiar with the regs...this program will help us comply.
