NATIONAL SAFETY CONFERENCE 2008

More than 125 fleet operations and safety managers from 75 different companies convened at the Dulles Hyatt in Herndon, Va., September 11-12 for NPTC's sixth annual National Safety Conference. **Brian Johnston** kicked off the meeting with a case study about how he helped develop a culture of safety at Greif. In a related vein, **Sam Richardson** of ADM Trucking talked about his innovative program of incentives, and **Rick Foster**, **CDS**, provided an inside look at Wal-Mart's innovative approach to driver wellness and safety.

How does driving history predict future crashes? FMCSA field inspector **Michael Fox** addressed that and other issues as he discussed the subject of safety issues affecting private fleets. **Dan Norris, CTP,** and **Ray Byrd** of the Pepsi Bottling Group took attendees behind the scenes for a hands-on approach to improving vehicle inspection procedures.

NPTC General Counsel **Rick Schweitzer** concluded the day with an insider's view of private fleet liability and the latest legislative and regulatory issues affecting private fleet safety.

After a problem-solving breakfast opening the second day, FMCSA's **Amy Houser** shared the agency's latest research and findings on the cost-benefit of active safety technologies. She was followed by **Dean Croke** of Seeing Machines who provided attendees with an in-depth look at how technology can be used to eliminate drowsy driving.

Next, **Thomas Deen** of Eaton spoke about the state of Michigan's unique training program to effectively train drivers on decision making skills. He was joined by **Jim Naatz** who spoke about integrating driving simulators into a training regimen. Finally, **Justine Russo** of Pitt Ohio Express shared her company's insights into how predictive modeling and analyzing safety data can lead to better safety strategies.

CERTIFIED TRANSPORTATION PROFESSIONAL (CTP®) UPDATE

Candidates for the Certified Transportation Professional® (CTP) program are encouraged to register now for their places in the Class of 2009. The Eligibility Application deadline is October 1, 2008.

By earning the CTP designation, you join a group of transportation professionals who have made a commitment to the private fleet industry, to an ongoing pursuit of career advancement, and to continuing enhancement of their knowledge and skills. Top management will readily identify you as a professional with the experience and knowledge to direct and administer a private fleet, traffic, or transportation operation.

Exam Locations

Examination locations are now posted on NPTC's web site, www.nptc.org. The exam will take place Saturday, February 14, 2009, at more than 40 sites in the U.S. and Canada.

Exam Applications Due

Confirmed candidates must return their Exam Application and fee by the November 15, 2008, deadline.

Be Prepared—We'll Show You How!

NPTC offers several programs that are designed to help candidates prepare for the CTP® Exam:

Fleet Learning Center—An online training center offering five interactive courses encompassing the knowledge needed to complete the CTP® Program. You have 60 days to complete each course.

Exam Prep Workshop—Offered in January, it provides a review of the knowledge considered essential for passing the CTP® Exam. This is scheduled for Friday, January 16, 2009, in Jacksonville, Florida.

Since 1993, nearly 600 transportation professionals have earned the right to use the CTP® designation after their names. NATIONAL DRIVER ALL-STARS

One of the newest and most exciting programs unveiled by NPTC is the National Driver All-Stars program, which begins in the fall of 2009. A complimentary program to the NPTC Driver Hall of Fame recognition, the National Driver All-Stars is a way for private fleet drivers to gain national recognition based on meeting competitive high performance standards against their peer drivers throughout the country.

In September 2009, NPTC will host an event, in conjunction with our National Safety Conference, that will recognize the top 100 private fleet drivers based on a criteria including how that driver stacks up against his or her own internal corporate standards and not some arbitrary industry standards.

Specific measures will be:

- ▶ Customer Service (uniform/appearance; on-time deliveries; attitude/conduct; customer feedback; loading/unloading; cooperation)
- Safety (number of DOT reportable accidents; number of OSHA reportable injuries; number of traffic violations verified by current MVR)
- Description Compliance with company standards (attendance, attendance at safety meetings, training, paperwork, etc.)
- ▶ Regulatory compliance (hours of service, DVIR, MVR, etc.)
 - ▶ Community service

Customers, both internal and external, will be encouraged to support the driver's application with testimonial input about the driver's performance.

Other requirements of the program are that you must be an NPTC member and you must provide a current Motor Vehicle Record for the past three years. Applicants must be a regularly employed, full-time, leased, or dedicated driver and actively driving for the 12-month period beginning June 1, 2008, through May 31, 2009. There is only one entry per company.
