Top CTP Grad: Program Gives Broader Business Understanding

eah, that's what they tell me," this year's top Certified Transportation Professional (CTP) program graduate, **Joe Sponseller** of Dean Foods, says with a laugh when it's brought up that he earned that honor for the Class of 2016.

As is often heard with the top grads of the National Private Truck Council's (NPTC) CTP program, Sponseller didn't expect to be at the head of the class. He remembers telling colleagues at Dean Foods that he was "just was hoping to pass." The program opened his eyes, he says, to the many business facets of trucking and transportation.

"It was a good opportunity for me to hear different opinions and get a lot of information across the industry that I hadn't picked up on," Sponseller says. "It gives you a better understanding, talking with people who work in different businesses—construction, food and produce, less-than-truckload, all sorts of different things where you may not really think of the challenges that they run into.

"So it's a great opportunity to network, learn a ton and understand more of the industry as a whole," he continues.

Now age 26, Sponseller joined Dean, a dairy foods producer and distributor, after he finished undergrad in 2012 and works out of the company's office in Franklin Park, IL, just outside Chicago. He now works in logistics support for Dean's approximately 4,800 trucks; Dean operates one of the nation's largest reefer truck fleets and is the largest processor and distributor of dairy products in the U.S.

But his first experience with trucking and fleet was back where he grew up a little farther north in Gurnee, IL, on breaks from attending college one state over at St. Ambrose University in Iowa. "Over the summers and on some of the breaks, I would go home and work at a local beverage distributor there in my county. That was my first touch of the trucking and distribution

industry," Sponseller contends, and says it gave him a better understanding of business.

"I worked in a warehouse at night loading trucks for delivery. Then I'd work with the drivers going stop to stop unloading product, collecting payment, that kind of thing," he continues. "Working on the trucks back then kind of changed the way I thought about business—just in terms of the movement of products and the flow of goods across the country. After I graduated from college, I knew I wanted to get into some sort of supply chain/distribution-type job."

Through his work at Dean Foods for the last several years and his experiences gained through the CTP program, he said he's realized how much transportation and logistics have changed in recent years with the use of technology—and how much more they could change now by utilizing that technology to its potential.

"The way the industry is changing to be technology- and data-driven really piqued my interest," Sponseller says. He now works in data and logistics support and is involved in a large project at Dean as the company is putting in new telematics systems across the fleet.

And he expects good things going forward from his career in transportation and logistics, he says, as he's working to lay the groundwork for it. In another big move, he got married last year, and there's something else, it being sometimes easy to get out of shape working at a desk or in various jobs in the trucking industry: to keep his edge, Joe is getting into competitive weight-lifting.

"Within the past couple months I picked up power lifting, and I'll be competing in my first power-lifting meet in June," he notes.
